Superintendent - Brian Poe

- 1. Lights at middle school parking lot were fixed
- 2. Suburban League met yesterday:
 - a. Athletic Directors & Principals
 - b. Entrance Fees: \$4 students / \$8 adults across the Suburban League (cash and pre-sales)
- 3. PROJECTS: Middle School
 - a. Survey scheduled for this Friday
 - b. There are remaining concerns, though we hope that a positive result on Friday's survey should be what we need to get started.
 - c. We will start with the field first. Vasco is ready to go as soon as everything is approved.
- 4. PROJECTS: High School
 - a. Meetings held with Summit Construction twice weekly and communication is continuous. Things are progressing well so far.
 - b. We are now making decisions about very detailed aspects of the project.
- 5. Bid opening is 2/7/24 for remaining MS & HS projects (e.g. restrooms, HS entry, etc.)
- 6. PROJECTS: Fencing
 - a. Custom Fence is doing the work and all is going well. They are moving as they can.
 - b. All existing fencing, except the tennis courts, is being replaced with black vinyl coating.
- 7. PROJECTS: Parking Lots
 - a. We are working with Environmental Design Group
 - b. Safety is our number one concern
 - c. QUESTION: What about tardies?
 - Need to address with HS administration
 - ii. Mr. Poe will touch base with Mr. Smith
- 8. QUESTION: Are the pool entry way and locker rooms included in the projects?
 - a. Locker room, yes.
 - b. Hallway, not.
- 9. QUESTION: Estimate of Stadium completion? Other renovations?
 - a. HS Stadium: August 15, 2024
 - b. MS Stadium: Ongoing over the summer
 - c. We will know more after February 7th.
 - d. Many activities will be impacted, but we are doing our best to keep things running with as little interruption as possible. Safety will be our focus.
- 10. QUESTION: Vaping and drug use in the HS bathrooms?
 - a. We will not be installing vape detecting devices due to the fact that notifications are too delayed to be effective.
 - b. At the HS & MS we have prevention specialists to provide specific programming around vape uses and drug abuse.



- We have processes for assigning staff members to monitor bathrooms throughout the day.
- d. The addition of family restrooms will also help to prevent groups of students in the restrooms, as well.

Assistant Superintendent - Brian Williams

- Our administrators are working very hard to provide wrap around services to deal with discipline issues in the schools.
 - a. Administration receives a report of all students that receive in-school or out-of-school suspension and monitors this list. Meetings are held with students, staff, and families to ensure the best outcomes.
 - b. We are working to be more consistent and provide consequences for behaviors to support student growth.

Business Manager - Steven Robinson

- Nothing additional at the moment.
- 2. QUESTION: Are the parking lot lights on a timer? They have been inconsistently on.
 - a. Will look into it. There were power outages in the district, so they may be on a time that needs to be reset.

We were able to provide so much that the Free Store was able to stay open two days in January instead of the usual single day. 
