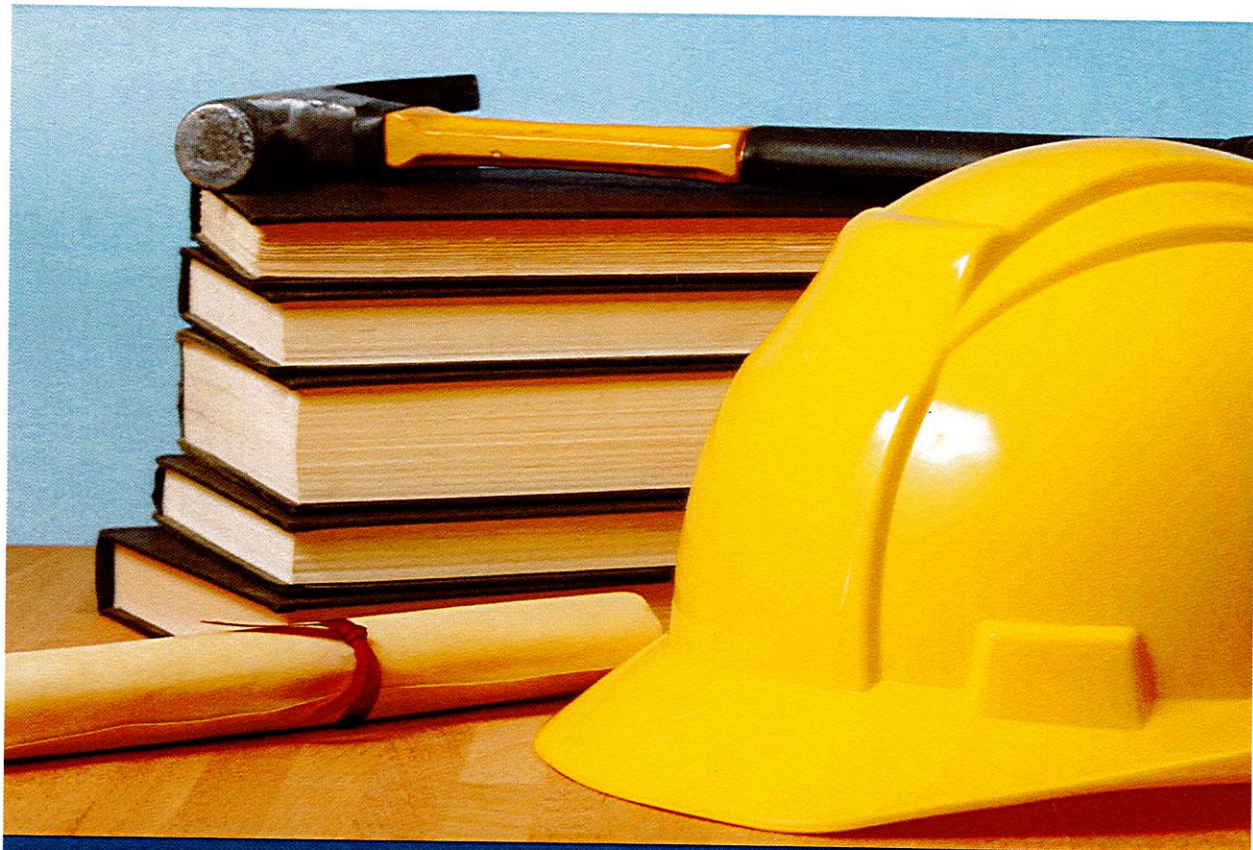

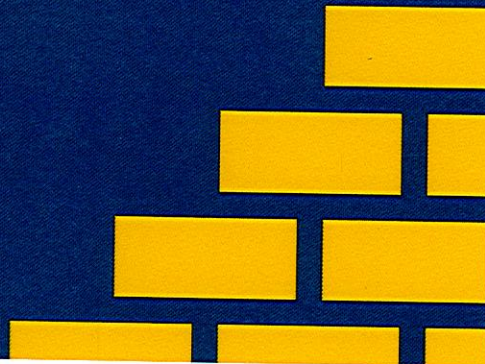

Presented by Honesty for Ohio Education:

Honesty for Ohio Education gave an update on what is going on in the Statehouse, the State Board of Education, and the Department of Education and Workforce.

Some of the Most Controversial Bills of this General Assembly include:

1. Senate Joint Resolution 2 (SJR 2)

- Allows just 41% of voters to kill constitutional amendments.
- Requires signatures from all 88 Ohio counties, instead of the current 44 counties (tough to do unless you're a well-funded campaign...)
- Removes the 10-day "cure period" Ohioans currently have to collect additional signatures if they fall short

SJR is the resolution that became Issue 1 in an illegal August election in 2023.

2. SB 83 –

- Bans courses/curriculum from colleges and universities. Plus it bans workers from striking, and more.

Passed the Senate, passed the House committee.

Working to attempt to stop a full house vote.

3. HB 11 and SB 11 - Universal vouchers

Passed in the state budget. Now law.

4. HB 339 – Education Savings Accounts (ESAs) for non-chartered schools

5. SB 1 and HB 12 – Shift nearly all power away from Ohio's ELECTED State Board of Education and the Department of Education and gives it to a governor appointee.

Passed in state budget. Now Law.
